Thank goodness the part was played by Hayley who adopted the character completely and managed to give a creditable performance.

It was good to see yet more new faces in TOPs. Tony and Jill Ford played Lord and Lady Elwood and seemed to enjoy their roles. I hope to see them in future productions. What a masterly finish to the play when Chris Barker in a cameo appears as the postman to turn the tables on the batty Lord Elwood. Hilarious!

It should be emphasised that Otley PCC have agreed to offer the church tower as a site for an aerial, in order to facilitate County Broadband to provide a service to the village community. The church is not involved in promoting, or acting as a representative for them, or any other service provider.

Debenham Group Practice

Over the last several months, two of our salaried GP's have left the practice and as a consequence of the well-publicised shortage of GP's in Suffolk, in order to maintain our high level of patient care, we have been heavily reliant on locum GP's and whilst we have been able to access experienced quality locums in the past, with the crisis in recruitment and retention we cannot guarantee this going forward.

While we have been extremely fortunate to recently recruit an experienced fulltime GP Partner, Dr Philip Stewart, this only partly replaces the number of GP sessions previously provided by two of our salaried GP's.

In acknowledging that we have not been able to fully replace the number of GP sessions provided by the practice throughout the week across our three sites, we have had to review our weekly schedule accordingly. We do not wish to have to cancel surgeries at short notice or put our current staff under undue pressure, but in recognition of the need to maintain a daily service at all three sites, it has been necessary to make some changes to the opening times at both Otley and Grundisburgh and we apologise for any inconvenience that this may cause.

The revised opening times of our three surgeries will be displayed at all the surgeries and on our website.

These changes will come into effect on **Tuesday 31 May 2016**. We will be closely monitoring our service provision going forward in order to ensure we continue to provide the highest possible level of care to our patients. Thank you in anticipation of your understanding.
